Ceremonial flying of the Flag. Gareth Jones

Since the start of the 100th Anniversary commemorations of the First World War on 4th August 2014, we in Ugborough have flown the Union Flag at half-mast on the 100th Anniversary of the death of the men from Ugborough who lost their lives. A public thank you to Tom and Owen Davies who suggested this.

The Great War, as my grandparents and others of that generation knew it, still conjures up the horrors of humankind's folly; belligerent neighbours and political failure are still with us today. It was decided that monuments to the dead should not only be for Kings and Generals but the common man also deserved his and so it was that villages and towns throughout the country, raised monies to honour their dead. In some small villages this may be no more than a plaque in the local church, in others such as Ugborough, a sizeable monument was erected. The Ugborough memorial was dedicated in December 1921.

As with many others, it commemorates the dead of the Great War 1914-1918. Some, such as the Cenotaph in London, have the years 1914-1919. At 11 a.m. on 11th November we will remember the Armistice and the guns going silent hence why many memorials have 1914-1918. However, Germany did not surrender until 28th June 1919 with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles, men still died and were commemorated. In Ugborough we will not finish honouring our war dead until next March, "Their names liveth for evermore".




Our speaker Jo Woodcock will talk about "Life With My Guide Dog"

<u>Your Stars Tonight</u> From my present latitude in Iberia, Mars is still high above the horizon and glowering salmon red in the evening and far outshines Saturn and Jupiter lower in the western sky. Recently these planets have been joined by the waxing moon to give a series of

conjunctions, first pairing the slender Crescent moon with Jupiter, then a quarter moon with Saturn and finally, last night, there was a slightly ominous sight of a blood red Mars, its colour accentuated by the close proximity to a silver grey halfmoon, darting in and out from behind the clouds of a thunderstorm.

The 3x2x2 metres living space in a VW campervan is probably not dissimilar to what will be available when the first manned space vessel is sent to Mars and it can be a little constraining even when it is not being used to give birth to a Parish Newsletter or as a Pantomime rehearsal area. However these pressures have been exacerbated by a major communication disaster. One member of the team (who has asked to remain anonymous) was overwhelmed by the heat of Algarve sunshine and decided to plunge into the surf without delay. Instant total body cooling was achieved in a more violent fashion than anticipated when an unexpected six foot dumper resulted in a total wipe-out. However, it was only later that the collateral damage was revealed; where there had once been discreetly disguised hearing aids was now only a sand and salt water mix.

As a result conversations in the van have been rather loud and frequently repeated. Consideration for our camping neighbours has resulted in the development of a sign language which seems to be working well. The clenched fist for solidarity, the V for victory and the upraised palms combined with a heavenward look to signify ascending spiritual progress. I have also been encouraged to spend time in solitary contemplation of the stars and I am enjoying a binocular tour of asterisms – taking advantage of the human brains' aptitude to see patterns out of the random scatterings of stars.

For starters look to the west and find the bright star Altair in the constellation of Aquila. About a hand's width higher is a group of about a dozen stars that looks like an upside down coat hanger - and not surprisingly that's their nickname. Now turn to the opposite horizon to find the "W" of Cassiopeia and then drop vertically down to follow a long line of faint stars called "Kemble's Cascade" that end at a silvery haze of a nebula - a celestial depiction of a water fall plunging into a rock pool. And it is always worth looking out for the Pleiades which are now rising in the south. To the naked eye the seven stars look like a minicopy of the Plough, but through the binoculars they become a dazzling scatter of ice-cold diamonds that will glitter throughout the coming winter's sky

The future of our public toilets was discussed at the beginning of our October meeting, with SHDC Operational Manager (Environment Services) Cathy Aubertin answering Councillors' questions. SHDC intends to shut the toilets at the end of March 2019 to save money and reduce its budget deficit. It is offering to transfer them to Ugborough Parish Council and the likely cost to each Ugborough Parish Tax payer for the Parish Council to keep them open is likely to be in the order of an additional £5pa.

What do you think - Are the public toilets in Bittaford & Ugborough necessary, and should we take them on? Let the Parish Council know by emailing ugboroughpc@yahoo.co.uk

District Cllr Holway reported on proposed SHDC budget savings, including the public toilets, and grants to CVS & South Devon AONB. To raise funds, the District Council will be borrowing £60m to invest in commercial property & housing in the South Hams. A review of the waste services to bring them into line with the rest of Devon, may result in more recycling facilities - and perhaps fewer plastics will be excluded from recycling.

County Clir Hosking reported on the £8.5m half-year overspend in Children Services, which would be met by savings in non-statutory services.

Planning applications considered at the meeting are given below, with the parish Council recommendations given in **bold**:

- Change of use from agricultural to equestrian and erection of timber stable building to include toilet/kitchen facilities at Land adjacent to Quillet, Wrangaton Ref <u>0485/18</u> Neutral. The existing hedge should be retained for screening and to maintain habitat. Two stables acceptable, although a third stable would be acceptable on proof of additional land being available.
- Groundwork engineering operations to create new manege and erection of replacement stable at Land adjacent Torpeek Farm, Bittaford Ref 2465/18/FUL Mrs L Jones Neutral
- Readvertisement (Revised plans received) Change of use to allow storage (Use Class B8), laying of compacted hard surface and erection of 2.4metre perimeter fence at AX633555, Ermington Road, Ivybridge Ref 1050/18/FUL Neutral

- Change of use of agricultural building to residential use with changes to the
 external appearance of consent 1792/17/PDM Barn at The Shippen, Marridge
 Farm, Ugborough 2921/18/FUL Neutral
- Tree works application T1: Oak Fell, excessive lean over property; T2: Oak fell, poor crown, dieback; T3: Oak fell, dying; T4: Oak fell, dying; T5: Oak remove, windblown at Magnolia Barn, Ludbrook Ref 3044/18/TPO Neutral

Dogs mess on the Erme Playing Field (which is just in the Parish) is proving to a real problem - irresponsible dog owners using the Erme Valley Trail are letting their dogs mess in the playing field, which is used by adults and children (ugh!) The many waste bins there are not used, and the offences take place early morning or late in the evening, when SHDC are not there to catch offenders 'in the act'. Alternatives are being considered, such as a publicity campaign or volunteers visiting outside working hours. Councillors have suggested that the playing field should be fenced off - not a cheap option.

New benches are to be provided to replace those on the Ugborough Church lawn and at Hillhead Cross - where the removal of brambles revealed a very decrepit bench!

The Ugborough Post Box will be replaced, but you will have to wait, as Royal Mail has said '...we would not anticipate completion until the very end of the year now I'm afraid'.

Useful advice which may be of interest to you:

- Vulnerable and 'fuel poor' residents across Devon can apply for help to keep warm and reduce their energy bills by up to £300 a year. The Local Energy Advice Programme (LEAP) is a free advice service supported by Devon County Council and funded by energy suppliers. LEAP can install draught-proofing, low energy LED light bulbs, radiator panels and shower savers and provide energy efficiency advice and help look for a better deal on energy bills. - Citizens Advice are operating on a Wednesday from the Mansion, Totnes.
- SHDC is urging residents to sign up to the free Devon and Cornwall Alert Service provided by Devon and Cornwall Police. The two-way messaging system enables Devon and Cornwall Police to connect with their community, and tell people exactly what is happening in their local area, allowing them to respond directly with any information. Residents can choose what type of information they'd like to receive concerning crime and anti-social behaviour, witness appeals, crime prevention, community events and local good news. Registering for the alerts is a quick and simple online form, which can be

found at *https://alerts.dc.police.uk/* Printable forms are also available which can be completed by hand and returned. Residents can choose to receive messages via phone, mobile, text or email. Preferences can be updated at any time, and businesses can also register for the service.

FOCUS ON - Attendance Allowance - Citizens' Advice

If you or someone you know is over 65, has care needs or is vulnerable and doesn't already receive a disability payment, they may be entitled to Attendance Allowance.

Lots of older people who struggle with day to day care aren't claiming Attendance Allowance that could help them stay independent in their own homes longer, because they think they aren't entitled to it.

Attendance Allowance is a tax free weekly payment of £57.30 or £85.60 depending on the need. It's not means tested or dependant on savings, it won't affect your state pension and is exempt from the benefits cap. It can be spent on anything that makes life easier for you, someone to help with personal care, taxis to go shopping or to visit family and friends, bills, a stair lift, a cleaner/gardener or just ensuring you stay safe.

If you have had difficulties for 6 months or longer you can apply for Attendance Allowance, if you are in hospital you can apply but you won't receive anything until you come out. If you live in a private care home and pay your own costs you can also apply.

If you are terminally ill you can apply straight away and your application will be speeded up.

A Season of Remembering

The season of autumn is often a time when people of all ages reflect upon love and loss in special ways. Bereavement often raises all sorts of questions for us and when that loss concerns somebody dear to us there are huge consequences for our feelings and emotions. There are no quick, easy answers at those difficult times in our lives but there are good ways to remember those we see no longer.

The church has always set aside specific times of remembering those we love who have died, and this Season of Remembrance begins at the start of November. All Saints Day (when we remember those Christians who have died, who we don't know personally), and All Souls Day (when we remember all those we know who have died). Our Sunday morning services on Sunday 4th November will be celebrating the feast of All Saints. Later that day our Annual All Souls Service, when we invite you to add any names you would like to be read out and to light a candle to remember them, will take place at All Saints, Moreleigh, TQ9 7JN at 6.30 p.m. If you would like any relative or friend particularly remembered, please give me a ring (01548 821199) or email me at parish_sayle@me.com.

A week later, on Sunday 11th November - Remembrance Sunday, we will be joining with people throughout the world in the Centenary of the Armistice which ended the hostilities of the First World War, as well as continuing to remember all those who given the ultimate sacrifice in conflicts since. Thinking also of all those who continue to suffer the effects of world strife as we pray for peace and reconciliation.

This year we will be holding a special Vigil Service to mark the Centenary of the end of the Great War at 7 p.m. on Saturday 10th November at St Mary's Diptford,

TQ9 7NY. Please do feel free to come along as in the words of this Church of England's service we will use this time not only to, 'look back in sorrow for all those who suffered injury and loss; but also to look forward to that day when the kingdoms of this world will be ordered by God's peaceable reign'.
